Message from Chief Executive Officer

The past months have brought many changes to Stein Hospice as we, like other health care providers throughout the nation, face the challenges of delivering quality care in an ever-changing health care environment. As a result of these changes, Stein Hospice has strongly positioned itself to meet one of its biggest challenges, to encourage patients to enroll in hospice sooner in their illness. This would allow patients and families alike to benefit from Stein Hospice's rich array of services much earlier. In 2012, according to statistics published by the National Hospice and Palliative Care Organization, half of hospice patients received care for less than three weeks.

To reverse this trend, Stein Hospice is planning to publish a series of articles in area newspapers and sponsor several programs to educate health care professionals and the public about the benefits of early hospice care. The program, which is scheduled for October 22, will feature Dr. Michael Murphy, an internationally recognized hospice expert. In addition, Stein Hospice has established a Speaker's Bureau that will provide staff members to speak at churches and other organizations about the many facets of hospice care.

Another challenge facing Stein Hospice is how to provide access to pain and symptom management to the people of our community who are not yet eligible for hospice. To that end, palliative care clinics have been established at University Hospitals Seidman Cancer Center at Firelands Regional Medical Center, Firelands Regional Medical Center South Campus, North Coast Cancer Center and Fisher Titus Medical Center. Other outreach services will be launched in the coming months.

As we look forward to 2015, Stein Hospice, through the efforts of the Board of Directors, administration and staff members, has positioned itself to successfully tackle the demands of the changing health care environment, while continuing to provide the highest quality care you have come to expect from Stein.

In helping them to become lighter through the expression of love and forgiveness, he saw that most were able to die more peacefully, and the families were better prepared to let go.

Stein Hospice will be hosting a speaking engagement with Dr. Murphy on October 22nd for local physicians,

healthcare professionals, volunteers, clergy, and the greater community. Dr. Murphy will be speaking on love, loss, and forgiveness in our lives and sharing opportunities essential to living a more loving life. He will guide us towards shifting from a fear filled life to a peaceful and living by embracing compassion and forgiveness.
