## **Riding in Memory**

Donna Langenfelder always made sure she gave back. She was an active supporter at area soup kitchens and volunteered for secret shopping – often adding her own money to the gifts. She generously picked families in need of which to donate and prepare a hot meal.

"My mom always put a smile on others' faces," says her son, Bob Langenfelder.

A patient of Stein Hospice, Donna required the organization's services to achieve her final wish of dying at home. Bob chose to emulate his mother's giving ways in 2013, combining charity with his passion for bike riding, by introducing the first annual Stein Hospice Memorial Ride, held in her honor. The event offered three courses to cyclists. The third event of its kind, a family affair with Bob's siblings and extended families also participating, is scheduled for July 26th.

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# PK5K 2015: a chance to remember Mom

Patricia King Munn, a patient with Stein Hospice prior to her passing in September of 2013, was ahead of her years and one of the first in her area to have a laundry room on the first floor. She was a seller of postcards on eBay when many people her age were not comfortable touching a mouse.

"Our Mom was smart, funny and always interested in new things," says son Steve LaTourette. "When she was diagnosed that July and made the decision to forgo further treatment, we were devastated but respected her wishes. The loving care at Stein not only eased her pain but allowed us to grieve and prepare for the end."

A native of Cleveland Heights, Ohio, Pat spent many summers at Lakeside as a child and ultimately moved there permanently with her husband, Melvin Dell, Sr., in 1980. Family members indicate that it was very important to Pat to be at home for as long as possible, when it became



clear she was nearing the end of her life. Daughter Sarah Thomas is appreciative that Stein Hospice took over her mother's care so that the family did not feel the heavy weight of responsibility of ensuring her comfort. "We were grieving and so terribly sad that we were losing our mother, but we realized that the most important thing, at the time, was that she was being treated with compassion and dignity, and allowed to pass with kind hands caring for her," says Sarah.

"My respect and appreciation for the 'angels' at Stein," adds grandson Rob LaTourette. "Gram was always tough as nails and dutiful to and about our family, so I knew that she would

need the good care of hospice to get her physically and spiritually to a point where she could let go."

In addition to her forward-thinking approach to life, Pat had a love for community and a desire to give back, setting a selfless example for her children and others. She was an active member of the Danbury Zoning Board, the Ottawa County Senior Advisory Board, the Danbury Senior Center, and many committees of the Lakeside United Methodist Church and was, eventually, inducted into the Ottawa County Senior Hall of Fame.

Duplicating her giving nature, her family chose to honor her through a fall 2014 memorial event, The PK5K Run, set in Lakeside, and is preparing for the 2nd annual PK5K Run, to be held October 11, 2015.

"The PK5K is just a small way to give back ... while helping to make other people aware of all that Stein Hospice has done for our family and may do for themselves or their family in the future," says daughter Katie Hamann. "We were all personally able to see the many extras that are done at Stein. We had counseling that was available to us upon request ... doctors, nurses, and volunteers who were kind and gentle to our mother and the entire family, and the Hospice Choir that sat bedside with mom, singing beautiful songs that brought tears to my eyes ... Keeping mom's memory alive through this run/walk not only helps with the grieving process, but it is rewarding to know that the money raised will help other families through their difficult time." loved ones and, according to son Andy LaTourette, the family had been traveling to Lakeside, with its little shops, porches and dock reaching out into Lake Erie waters, since his great grandparents' generation. The one constant for everyone was Pat, and she was most at home there.

Sarah insists her mother would have loved everything about the memorial event set in her favorite place. She feels that, most of all, Pat would have loved that the PK5K is a chance for her family, and other families, to get together and participate in a fun and joyful activity.

"Our family is fortunate to have the resources to afford quality health care," says Sarah. "Sadly, this is not true for everyone. However, we learned that no one in Stein's reach is turned down from hospice services. That's really a pretty incredible and wonderful thing. The proceeds of the PK5K help Stein Hospice to provide, to those less fortunate, the same compassionate care our mother and many others have received ... Our wish is that this event will grow into large numbers, and together all of us can affect the world in a positive way."

"By holding the event in Lakeside, there is a sense of coming home," concludes daughter Eve Brooksieker. "With each step we took in the first PK5K, we were able to relive so many fond memories. This benefit is our way of keeping our mother's memory alive and giving back to an organization that will be able to give to others."
